

Lake Highland Preparatory School is a co-educational independent day school educating students in grades PK through 12. Founded in 1970, our two campuses on 42 acres are centrally located near downtown Orlando, attracting a diverse student population from the metropolitan area and surrounding counties. The lakefront main campus is home to our Upper and Lower Schools. The Charles Clayton Middle School Campus, five blocks away, provides students in grades 7 and 8 with their own dynamic atmosphere. The exceptional facilities on both campuses include advanced technology in all classrooms, science labs, the Harriett Coleman Center for the Arts, acres of practice fields, courts, an Olympic swimming complex, and a state-of-the-art fitness center. The school has a current enrollment of 2,042 students (806 students in grades 9 - 12) with 175 full and part-time faculty, including 78 with master's degrees and 3 with doctoral degrees.

Our mission statement is the foundation of the Lake Highland community:

The comprehensive and challenging curriculum helps develop critical and creative thinkers with a sincere passion for learning. Our centers of excellence encourage students to explore their gifts and further enrich their education. The **Advanced Studies in Science and Research Program (ASPIRE)** offers students with a keen interest in science the opportunity to pursue original scientific research. Students spend a minimum of three hours per week in a research laboratory working with a PhD or MD on advanced research projects. The **Rossman Writing Center** and **Key Instructional Leadership Team (KILT)** provide mentoring experiences for upperclassmen that foster leadership, service, responsibility, and an in-depth intellectual interest in an academic subject. The **Merit Studies Program** challenges the academically talented student in and out of the classroom. Merit Studies students must enroll in three or more honors level classes each semester, complete three years in the same classical or modern language, and achieve four credits at AP level. Students must maintain a 3.7 weighted grade point average to continue in the program.

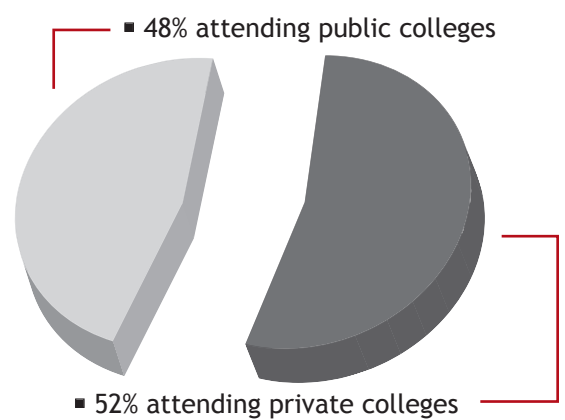
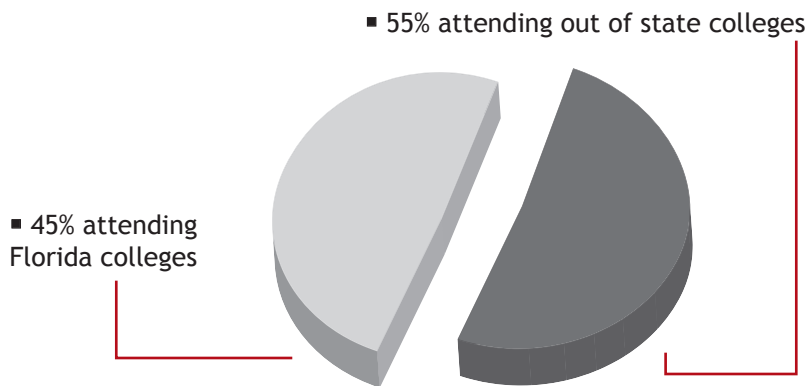
