Senior Exam Guidelines

Baseline: All seniors take second semester exams in all core classes (even if they'll be taking an AP exam in the class).

Exemptions: Students who have earned an average of **85% in an AP course** for the 3rd and 4th quarters (and have no more than 5 absences for either nine weeks period, and have no major disciplinary infractions) are exempt from the exam in that particular class. This exemption only pertains to LHPS course exams; AP students are still required to take the College Board AP exam.

**Second semester AP students in grades 9-11 may also be exempt from their second semester course examination with an 85% or above average. In some cases the student may still wish to take the exam if it can help raise their final grade. This is certainly acceptable and encouraged.*

Students who have earned an average of **90% in an honors or college prep course** for the 3rd and 4th quarters (and have no more than 5 absences for either nine weeks period, and have no major disciplinary infractions) are exempt from the exam in that particular class.

Notes: Ms. Johnson and Mr. Jakubisin will conduct ongoing attendance reviews during the final nine weeks. Students who have been absent more than 5 days for illness or accident will have the absence policy waived (all decisions are final and not open to petition).

Teachers should take stock of grade averages at the time of the fourth nine weeks progress reports (April 18th). That should be a good indicator of whether a student will need to take a test, however the final decision will be based on the student's semester average as of Wednesday, April 25th (Senior Seminar) so that they can be notified on Thursday, April 26th as to whether or not they will be taking an exam.

All teachers are to follow these guidelines carefully. No student should be exempted from an exam on the teacher's authority alone.

Additional Notes: The averages of 85% and 90% are for the 3rd and 4th quarters combined, not individually. (So a student could earn an 87% 3rd quarter and a 95% fourth quarter and still qualify for exemption from an honors level course exam.)

If a senior qualifies to take an exam this will apply to any core class in which s/he is enrolled. A core class teacher who has all juniors and one senior will have to prepare an exam for that senior to take on the assigned senior exam day.
